DARRELL MIMS

EXECUTIVE PASTOR OF FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION VICTORY CHURCH

Darrell Mims currently serves as the executive pastor of finance and administration/chief financial officer (CFO) for Victory Church in Norcross, Georgia. Darrell and his wife, Tanya, will have been married 40 years this July and have attended Victory Church for 26 years. They have two sons, Brendan and Julian, a daughter-in-law, Chae, and one grandchild, Jihae.

During his 26 years at Victory, Darrell has served as a parking lot volunteer, an assistant head usher and a Crown ministry facilitator. Twenty-one years ago, Darrell was called into ministry and took a position on staff in which he oversees several areas in the church including finance, administration, human resources, information technology, missions, Kings ministry, and the Money + Work ministry. Over the last 21 years, Darrell has had the pleasure of seeing Victory Church grow from a 300-member congregation to over 14,000 active members. In this time, some of his most memorable moments include the mission trips in which he had the privilege to participate. Those trips include Sierra Leone, where he helped develop and build a 600+ Christian elementary school for Joshua International; India, where he helped build and dedicate an orphanage outside of Bangalore; Mexico, where he helped find and close on Victory's mission base; and Kuwait, where he trained ministry leaders at an underground church.

Prior to being called into full-time ministry, Darrell spent 21 years in corporate America. He spent his first 16 years with Diamond Shamrock Chemicals and Occidental Petroleum Corporation working in accounting, financial planning/analysis and as a plant controller at different locations, primarily in Texas. He had the opportunity to work directly with senior management in the buyout and transition of Diamond Shamrock to Occidental Petroleum in 1984. In July 1994, at age 37, he was relocated to Atlanta, Georgia, to serve as CFO of H. J. Russell & Company, one of Georgia's largest privately-owned companies. One of his first responsibilities was helping to transition four of H. J. Russell's affiliated companies into one operating entity. Before leaving H. J. Russell & Company, Darrell worked on many real estate development projects for the Russells, including the mixed-use neighborhoods in the Castleberry Hills section of Atlanta.

Darrell graduated from American University in Washington, D.C., with a B.S. in accounting. He holds an MBA from Texas A&M University and is a licensed Georgia Certified Public Accountant.
